

# **All-Terrain Vehicles**



# About the activity

Driving our all-terrain vehicles (ATV) is an exciting opportunity to control a motorised vehicle. The driver learns how to steer, accelerate, brake and manoeuvre the ATV on our purpose-built track. Together with the passenger the team must tackle the challenges set. The four-wheeled buggies encourage skills of concentration, coordination and communication.

# Activity aims

#### The aim of this activity is to:

- Have fun.
- Show and develop coordination and control operating an all-terrain vehicle.
- Become confident and competent at driving an ATV.
- Learn a basic level of vehicle safety.

# **Progression opportunities**

#### Some participants may also:

- Complete challenges as a pair or a whole team.
- Develop higher level driving skills such as reversing and manoeuvring.

#### In addition, participants should also have developed the following:

- Coordination whilst operating an ATV.
- Decision-making skills.

# Learning outcomes

#### Upon completion of the activity, participants will have:

- Demonstrated the ability to listen to, understand and act on instructions received.
- Learnt how to put on the appropriate PPE in order to use an ATV.
- Learnt how to drive an ATV forwards, turning and stopping in a controlled manor.
- Acquired a basic understanding of safe operation of an ATV
