

Sensory Trail



About the activity

The sensory trail is a challenge in more ways than one. During the activity your pupils will negotiate a series of obstacles – blindfolded – with the other members of their group for guidance. It's a challenge which raises questions about our abilities and assumptions, and demands mutual trust, self-belief, and effective communication to complete the course successfully.

Activity aims

The aim of this activity is to:

- Introduce the sensory trail activity and the necessary equipment.
- Allow each participant to experience the sensory trail activity.
- Ensure participants work together supporting and encouraging each other.
- Provide an opportunity for participants to discuss what they have accomplished.

Progression opportunities

Some participants may also:

- Explore how the other senses become heightened when another is lost or reduced.
- Understand how different senses work.
- Take the initiative in evaluating their performance and that of the group.
- Be able to assess risks and understand how these may be controlled.

In addition, participants should also have developed in the following:

- Interpersonal communication
- Teamwork

Learning outcomes

Upon completion of the activity, participants will have:

- Explored how their senses work.
- Demonstrated the ability to listen to, understand and act on instructions received.
- Understood the rules of the games and trail and why they need to be followed.
- Developed an understanding of associated hazards.
- Effectively worked in teams supporting their peers throughout the activity and recognized their achievements.
- Contributed to a post-activity review led by the instructor identifying what they did well
 and then suggested ways to improve.
