Certificate held?

Periodic inspections by Commission de Sécurité. Integrated fire alarm in Farmhouse and smoke detection in Cabins

Rooms lockable?

Cabins, yes. Farmhouse dormitories are not lockable but entrance to the farmhouse if via a key coded door closed at night.

External doors locked at night?

Farmhouse Yes. Cabins have thumb turn locks allowing young persons to lock/unlock from inside and adults to unlock/lock from outside
